Paragraph A:

Although they live in water, whales are not fish. They are mammals and are warm-blooded. Their thick layer of fat helps keep them warm in cold water. Whales propel themselves through the water with their tails. Most of them have a stiff fin on their back to help them stay on course while they swim. Whales have flippers on each side of the front of their body. They use them to steer, to stop, and to knock away an attacker. Whales have lungs and breathe through a blowhole at the top of their head. When a whale comes to the surface and exhales, water in the blowhole bursts into the air.

Whale babies grow very quickly. Blue whales grow the fastest of all. They drink about forty-four gallons of milk a day and gain seven pounds an hour. From the time it is born underwater, a baby whale stays very close to its mother. Even though it cannot swim yet, the first thing a newborn whale must do is come to the surface of the water for air. Its mother helps it to the surface until the baby is able to swim on its own. The mother spends many months with her baby until it can take care of itself.

Blue whales, the largest animals on the earth, can grow to over eighty-five feet and weigh as much as one hundred tons. Because of their large size and incredible speed, whales have few enemies besides humans. However, pollution is the greatest threat that whales face today. Pollution interferes with the ability of whales to navigate, making them swim into shallow waters and wash ashore. Oil spills, sewage dumping, and toxic waste cause the foods that whales eat to become poisons in their bodies.

Paragraph C:

The youngest American to circle the earth in a spacecraft and the first American woman in space were the same person, Sally Ride. Born on May 26, 1951, Sally grew up knowing that she could do anything she set her mind to do. She believed in herself, worked hard, and was successful in school and in sports. She was determined to do her best in whatever she tried. She also liked to travel with her family and learn all about people in other countries.

Even though Sally was younger than her classmates, she graduated at the top of her class. Her favorite subject was science. In college Sally studied the science of stars and planets called astrophysics. She graduated from Stanford University and became a research assistant, but what she really wanted to do was be an astronaut. NASA looked for people who were the very best in what they did. Only thirty-five of those who applied to the space program were actually chosen for the astronaut class in 1978. Sally Ride was one of them.

Sally was only thirty-one years old when she went into space in 1982. She rode in the spaceship Challenger and was a mission specialist. When the six-day mission was over, Sally Ride had made history. One year later she became the mission specialist on the second flight of the Challenger spacecraft. She ran scientific experiments and helped put two satellites into orbit. She even worked a fifty-foot robot arm, which was the first to be used in space. The mission took six days to complete and traveled 2.5 million miles. Sally Ride's ability and hard work helped to make the missions a success.
